A new facility is being proposed which would be home to the VPAG, Museum and contain a multi-purpose space for other community groups. The new facility would be the anchor for a cultural hub in downtown Vernon; it would be a showcase building that would potentially attract more downtown development.

The Vernon Public Art Gallery (VAPG) is a not-for-profit, charitable organization committed to fostering an appreciation of the visual arts for all members of the community. It began in 1945 when a Travelling Pictures Committee was established to display local and travelling exhibitions. The VPAG has evolved throughout the years and in 1995, relocated to its current (temporary) location at 3228 31st Avenue.

The VAPG plays a vital role in cultural tourism, community development and learning within the Greater Vernon region. The Gallery attracts thousands of visitors annually, conducts programming for learning, and has a network of dedicated volunteers in the community.

The VPAG presents exhibitions featuring emerging, mid-career and established artists working in a variety of media, including paintings, sculpture, multi-media and installation art. It's the largest public gallery in the North Okanagan and offers approximately 20 exhibitions per year for public viewing. The Gallery has formed a partnership with the Kelowna Art Gallery and the University of British Columbia – Okanagan, to bring world-class printmaking for viewers through the Okanagan Print Triennial. The Gallery features annual exhibitions by Vernon's School District #22 students, as well as members of the Kama? Creative Aboriginal Arts Collective, and also through the Mackie Lake House Artist in Residence program. However, in order to
